WRAP PROCESS

Congratulations, you have decided to wrap you boat! Here is your step by step guide to how the process works.

STEP 1: Deposit & Wrap Contract

To start the process we require a deposit (\$300 minimum) and a completed wrap contract. If you have a deadline to meet, at this time we can put your wrap on the schedule and work backwards with due dates. Once you are on the schedule, we will establish design approval deadlines and time for drop off. It is very important to hit these due dates or your install date could be pushed back.

STEP 2: Photos & Design

At the time of your deposit or after we ask that you submit photos of your boat and details of your design concept to our graphic design department. To make this process go quick and smooth it is important to have a good idea of what you'd like your wrap to look like and communicate that with us. Typically you will receive your first proof within 2 to 4 business days, however late March through May is our busy season and we will try to let you know if we are experiencing delays.

STEP 3: Measurements

If needed our graphic designer will send you information on what we will need measured. If you'd like you may set up a time to bring it by to be measured prior to installation.

STEP 4: Design Approval

Once your design is finalized, the art department will send you a finalized proof, please sign and return.

STEP 5: Schedule

Lets get this wrap on the schedule! Boats can be dropped off at night or on the weekends, but they will not be pulled into the shop until the next business day morning. Boats can also be picked up on the weekends but must be paid in full prior to leaving. We will give you an approximate amount of time that it will take to complete the wrap.

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WRAP PROCESS

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STEP 6: Color Swatch Approval

This step is optional, it is a \$10 up charge but worth it especially if you are trying to match up colors to your interior or you are choosing a grey in your wrap. The color swatch will be a small print of your wrap mailed to an address you provide. If you chose to skip the color swatch approval process, we will not be held responsible for wrap colors.

STEP 7: Printing

Once the design and color swatch are approved, there can be no more changes made. Your wrap will start printing. Depending on the size of boat, this process can take any where from 4 to 8 hours. After the print has finished it needs to outgas for 24 hours.

STEP 8: Lamination

Our printed graphics are laminated after they are finished out-gassing. The lamination protects the print and extends the life of your graphics.

STEP 9: Getting Ready for Installation

The first and most important step is to make sure we have a clean surface. All graphics that are not under the gel coat are stripped, including boat registration numbers and the state sticker are removed along with any removable hardware. Then the boat goes through a 3 step cleaning process.

STEP 10: Installation

This is the time when our installer really needs to focus to meet the time frame that he has estimated. The best way to communicate during this process is via email in order to minimize any interruptions (phone calls or visits) during installation. No photos will be sent during this process.

STEP 11: Completion

We will coordinate with you a time to pick up your boat.
